## VISITORS AT KIN MEETING

It was visitors' night for the Kinsmen Club last night at their regular meeting in the Commodore Cafe. Guests of the club were May Queen Margaret Strachan and three of her princesses and three members of the Terrace Progress Club who were here to lay preliminary plans for the formation of a Kin Club at the interior town.

As a momento of her reign as May Queen, Margaret Strachan was presented with a sterling silver clasp bracelet engraved "Kinsmen May Queen — 1946" while Princesses Lydia Ponich, Pat Stuart and Beverley Matson were presented with bracelets bearing their engraved names. Princess Sonja Sorenson was absent from the city.

Terrace delegates Clarence Michiel, Joseph Schutziak and Leonard Casey, complemented the Prince Rupert Club on its efforts to establish a boys' summer camp at Lake Lakelse and proposed the support of the Terrace Progress Club in the enterprise. Following the business meeting they met the executive committee to lay tentative plans for the granting of a Kin charter to Terrace in the fall.

Camp committee chairman reported that satisfactory progress is being made on the summer camp project, and the campsite and building committees called for volunteers for another week-end party at the campsite this week.

An invitation by the national organization for the local club to send a delegate to the national conference of Kinsmen Clubs at Banff in September was tabled without a delegate being appointed.


