The Experts
Say...

ICE CREAM — Summer days mean ice cream for dessert and it doesn't matter whether it actually contains cream as long as it's frozen.

Chocolate Freeze is recommended by home economists and is a delicious frozen dessert made with milk but having the smooth texture that is usually obtained only with the richest cream.

Chocolate Freeze requires 1 1/2 squares of unsweetened chocolate, 2 1/2 cups of scalded milk, 1/4 cup of sugar, a few grains of salt, two tablespoons of flour, two egg yolks slightly beaten, 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla, two egg whites, 1/4 cup of sugar, 1/4 teaspoon of almond flavoring.

Melt the chocolate in top of double boiler. To scalded milk add sugar and salt. Add gradually to chocolate, stirring well. Blend flour with a little cold water and add to the chocolate mixture. Cook for 10 minutes longer. Remove from the heat and cool. Add vanilla. Pour into freezing tray and partially freeze about 45 minutes with a control set at the lowest point. Beat egg whites until stiff, but not dry. Gradually beat in the remaining 1/4 cup of sugar and the almond flavoring. Remove chocolate mixture to chilled bowl and blend with meringue, using a Dover beater.

Return to freezing tray and continue to freeze, stirring occasionally until firm, about 1 1/2 hours. This makes six to eight servings.

HOW CAN I???

Q. How can I keep clothing free from moths?

A. The odor of branches of the arbor vitae is very pleasant and wholesome, and will keep the clothing that is to be packed away free of moths.

Q. How can I prevent white silk from turning yellow?

A. White silk should not be washed in water that is too hot, as it has a yellowing effect on it.

Q. How can I avoid spattering of grease?

A. The spattering of hot grease can be avoided many times by placing a little salt in the frying pan.

AUCKLAND, N.Z., @ — One of the few Maori women to have won a university degree is Miss Petricevich who has graduated as a bachelor of arts at Auckland University College. Until the present, very few native women have taken university courses but it is thought that her success may encourage others.

Many Maori men have graduated from universities, and one, Dr. Peter Buck, has achieved world-wide recognition for his studies in anthropology. He is head of the Bishop Museum in Honolulu and has been guest professor at Yale.

perishable food. Here are some emphasized "do's":

Do test sealers before using. Make sure that there are no chips in the rims.

Do have the sealers clean. Wash in hot soapy water and rinse thoroughly.

Do grade or sort the fruit or vegetable for uniformity or size and maturity. Discard all bruised and spotted fruit.

Do use the thinnest syrup that will be palatable. This stretches the sugar ration: One cup of sugar to two cups of water is sufficient for most fruits and a thinner syrup, one cup of sugar to three cups of water, is sweet enough for pears.

Do leave a space of 1/4 inch at the top of the sealer when filling with fruit or vegetables except peas and corn which require 1/2 inch head space.

Do not allow filled containers to stand and get cool before processing.

HOME CANNING—This year again home canning will take an important place in the home-maker's plans for conserving
