Boy Scouts Reorganized

Prince Rupert Ass'n Formed With T. E. Anfield as Chairman and Col. Dixon as District Commissioner

The Boy Scout movement is being resumed in this city as another activity for the welfare and healthful activity of the lads and youths of Prince Rupert. Last night the Prince Rupert Boy Scout Association was organized at a meeting in the committee room of the Civic Centre with F. Earl Anfield as chairman and Lt. Col. Keith Dixon as district commissioner. Two Scout groups are already in operation here and early expansion is anticipated.

Decision to develop the Boy Scout movement here is the result of a survey made by Ken Jordan of Vancouver, British Columbia commissioner, who found that there was a definite potential here. Mr. Jordan was in attendance at last night's meeting and guided it through its early stages, advising and recommending lines of procedure. There was a general discussion of all phases of Scouting activities as applicable locally.

Concurrent with the perfecting of the local executive, steps will be taken to organize groups additional to those already in existence.

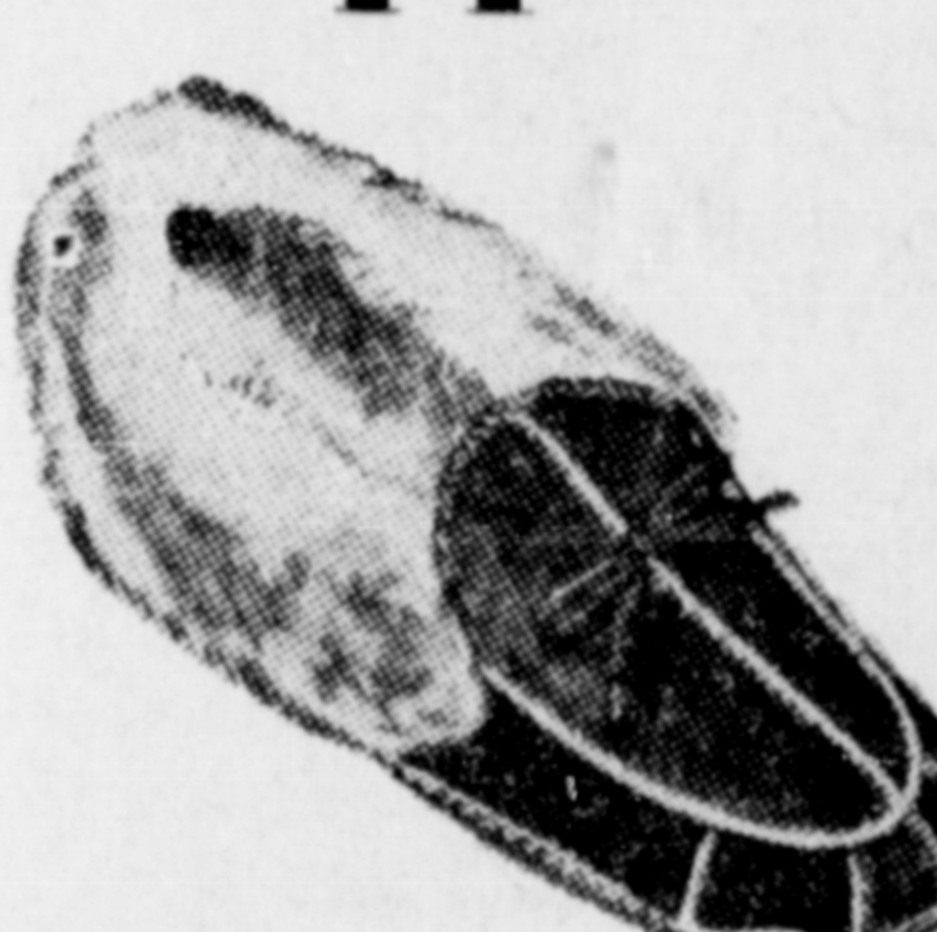

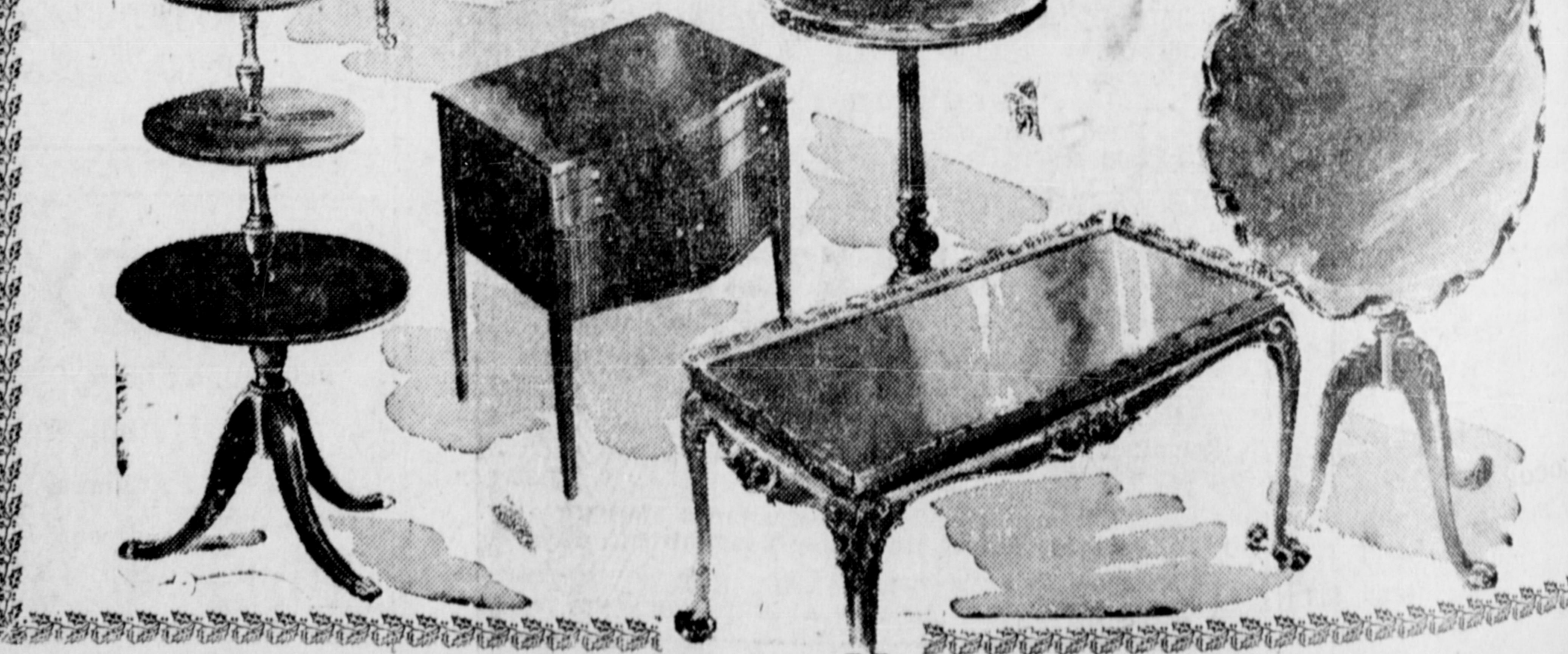
