**Civic Centre Was Attended By 12,000 Persons During October**

Statistical lists usually make dry reading to most people, but the monthly report of Prince Rupert's Civic Centre for October is an exciting document to the staff and executive of the community centre for it shows the amazing way the building has become the hub of recreational and cultural life in the city.

Recorded attendance at the Civic Centre during October was 12,176, which considering that the city's population is slightly over 8,000, is an eloquent testimony of the interest taken in the centre and its works.

"That is an extremely conservative figure," Managing Director Don Forward commented. "It does not take into consideration the people who just entered the building to look around. It represents those who actually took part in events in the Civic Centre."

Neither does it take into account the number of people who entered the public library, which was installed on the second floor of the centre and operated there for 12 days during October.

Total number of events which took place during the month were 216, of which 51 were meetings of various sorts in the different rooms.

Busiest spot in the building, was of course, the gymnasium, where 2,961 people attended 121 events. These ranged from basketball games to Rap-Rec classes for all ages, and included basketball practices and badminton tournaments.

Although there were considerably fewer events in the auditorium, the month's total being

books during that period.

"I don't think that interest in the building can be questioned," Mr. Forward continued. "Take last Monday, for instance. That was a typical day. There were 12 events in the building on Monday, and in the evening, every bit of available space was taken up. When people say the building is too big they should call around and see the difficulty we have accommodating community activities at times."

The solarium, which is a place where the sun shines at the turn of a switch, cast a warm glow over 224 persons who stood under the sunlamps. The adult games room served 280 persons while the canteen was visited by 4,900.

Roosevelt Park gym was attended by 370 people who took part in badminton, lacrosse, boxing and basketball practices and games.

In the various meeting rooms of the Civic Centre, groups representing practically every section of the population gathered sometime during the month. At the 51 meetings which took place there, there was an attendance of 1,315.
