Three Rinks Are Unbeaten

SASKATOON — Three rinks, representing Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, are still undefeated after two rounds of play in the MacDonald's Brier bonspiel at Saskatoon. The Manitoba and Alberta rinks had close calls in their second-round competition before emerging victorious.

The Leo Johnson Manitoba rink barely edged out Quebec 11-10 while Alberta topped the British Columbia rink 13-11. Saskatchewan whipped Nova Scotia 14-7 while Ontario defeated Prince Edward Island 12-6 and Northern Ontario conquered New Brunswick 13-4.

The Manitoba rink, which is favored to retain its crown, did not forge ahead to stay until the eleventh end.

Alberta climaxed a sensational comeback with a two-ender in the twelfth end to gain their win over British Columbia by just that margin. None of the other matches was in doubt after the first few ends.

There were two draws scheduled for today, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. The morning draw brought Quebec against Saskatchewan. New Brunswick against Ontario and Manitoba against Alberta.

In the afternoon Saskatchewan plays against Northern Ontario, New Brunswick against Quebec, Ontario against Manitoba, Alberta against Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia against British Columbia.

The Detroit Red Wings have moved into a third place tie with the Boston Bruins in the National Hockey League. The Wings took over possession of the spot with the Bruins when they whipped the league-leading Montreal Canadiens 4 to 2 as Chicago was beating the Bruins 5 to 3 Sunday night. In the other N.H.L. game Sunday night the fifth place Leafs won their second game in as many nights by whipping the last place New York Rangers 5 to 2. The results of the weekend games bunched the first four teams closer. Now there are only four points separating the teams. Canadiens, in first place, have a one point lead over Chicago Black Hawks and they in turn are three points in front of the Wings and Bruins.

Canada's premier curling event—the MacDonald's Tankard Brier—got under way yesterday afternoon in Saskatoon. The bonspiel is resumed this year after a three-year lay-off because of wartime transportation difficulties. The official opening was at three o'clock in the afternoon. A second draw was held at 8 p.m. and today there were draws at nine and in the morning and three this afternoon. Tonight the MacDonald's Brier banquet will be held and Defence Minister Douglas Abbott will be the guest speaker.

The British light heavyweight boxer, Freddie Mills, has arrived in Britain for demobilization and a title bout with the British Empire heavyweight champion, Bruce Woodcock. The bout is set to take place on June 4. Woodcock is also scheduled to fight in Madison Square Garden in New York on May 13. Before leaving for New York he plans to have two warm-up bouts.

A record number of night games will be played in National League this season, it is revealed by the release of the official 1946 schedule of the senior circuit. The St. Louis Cardinals, as in previous years, will play the most games under the arcs. The Red Birds will take the field for 38 night home games. The Boston Braves, with newly-installed lights, are next with 29 and the rest of the clubs will play 14 at home.

Detroit Moves Right Up With Rest of Leaders

TORONTO, 6.—There were two games in the National Hockey League Saturday night. In Toronto, the Maple Leafs showed a reversal of form and trounced the second-place Chicago Black Hawks 9-4. Syl Apps scored four goals while Sweeney Schriner scored three goals to bring his all-time scoring total for the league to 199 goals.

In Montreal, the Detroit Red Wings and the Canadiens fought to a 3-3 tie with the Flying Frenchmen, coming from behind twice to earn the draw.

Sunday night, by defeating Montreal, Detroit Red Wings went right up among leaders of the league in a tie with Boston for third place. Chicago Black Hawks beat the Bruins and are now but one point behind the Canadiens.

CHICAGO—The president of the Chicago Black Hawks, Bill Tobin, says that his National Hockey League club has not approached the Toronto Maple Leafs with an offer to buy or trade players for Sweeney Schriner and Lorne Carr.
