Research of Photographic

Crews Opens New Fields of Northland for Exploration

OTTAWA (P) - The R.C.A.F.. map out her uncharted empire, photographed more than 370,000 square miles of Northern Canada this summer in continuation of a job that has gone on for 20 years and will continue for many more.

To the end of August air survey crews working out of suboperating from sub-Arctic points photographed 202,000 large-scale vertical method and another 170,000 square miles by the tri-camera method. The latter system takes in a greater area than the one-camera method of vertical photography but the air pictures do not possess the same finness of detail.
