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Saturday Sermon
ORDINARY CHRISTIANITY

REV. BASIL PROCKTER, Rector, St. Andrew's Cathedral
There is a story told of a man well advanced in the third or fourth stage of intoxication who knocked on the door of the parsonage and said: "Reverend, I want to talk about religion." "You had better come back when you are sober," replied the padre. "No," the man said, "that's no good. When I'm sober I'm not interested."

During the war years a sort of hysteria swept over our country and most other countries which can be likened to the intoxication of the man in the story. The prime minister gets on the national network and tells us all to go to church. Newspapers and business houses buy and give feet of space to tell us to go to church. Both privately owned and nationally owned radio donates hours of time to religious broadcasts. We have National Days of Prayer and Victory Loan Sundays to say nothing of the people paid by the Wartime Information Board to supply literature to the clergy absolutely free so that they won't even have to go to the trouble of writing their own sermons.

Now, presumably, we return to days of the peace which the world can give and I wouldn't be surprised if the sobering process does not bring with it an

acknowledgment on the part of many of these hysterical elements that in ordinary times they are not particularly interested. Let me say that I welcome a return to what might be called ordinary Christianity. I cannot help feeling that a great deal of this religious propaganda carried on by secular agencies is or will be in the long run more harmful than helpful. There was a time when a great many people were in the habit of attending church regardless of the subject of the sermon, who was preaching, who was doing the solo, what the anthem was, or whether it was Easter Day, Mother's Day, Victory Loan Sunday or a National Day of Prayer. Now, by these means, the emphasis has been shifted and a great many people regard the special day as the day to go to church almost simply and solely for sentimental rather than dogmatic reasons with the result that a great deal of that kind of church attendance has no significance at all. It doesn't signify if people go or if they stay away on a Victory Loan Sunday, from the standpoint of true religion. Nor, for that matter, on Easter Day when that is regarded as the special time to go... as if forsooth, the fourth commandment had been altered to read one day in seventy!

What we need today is a return to ordinary Christianity
