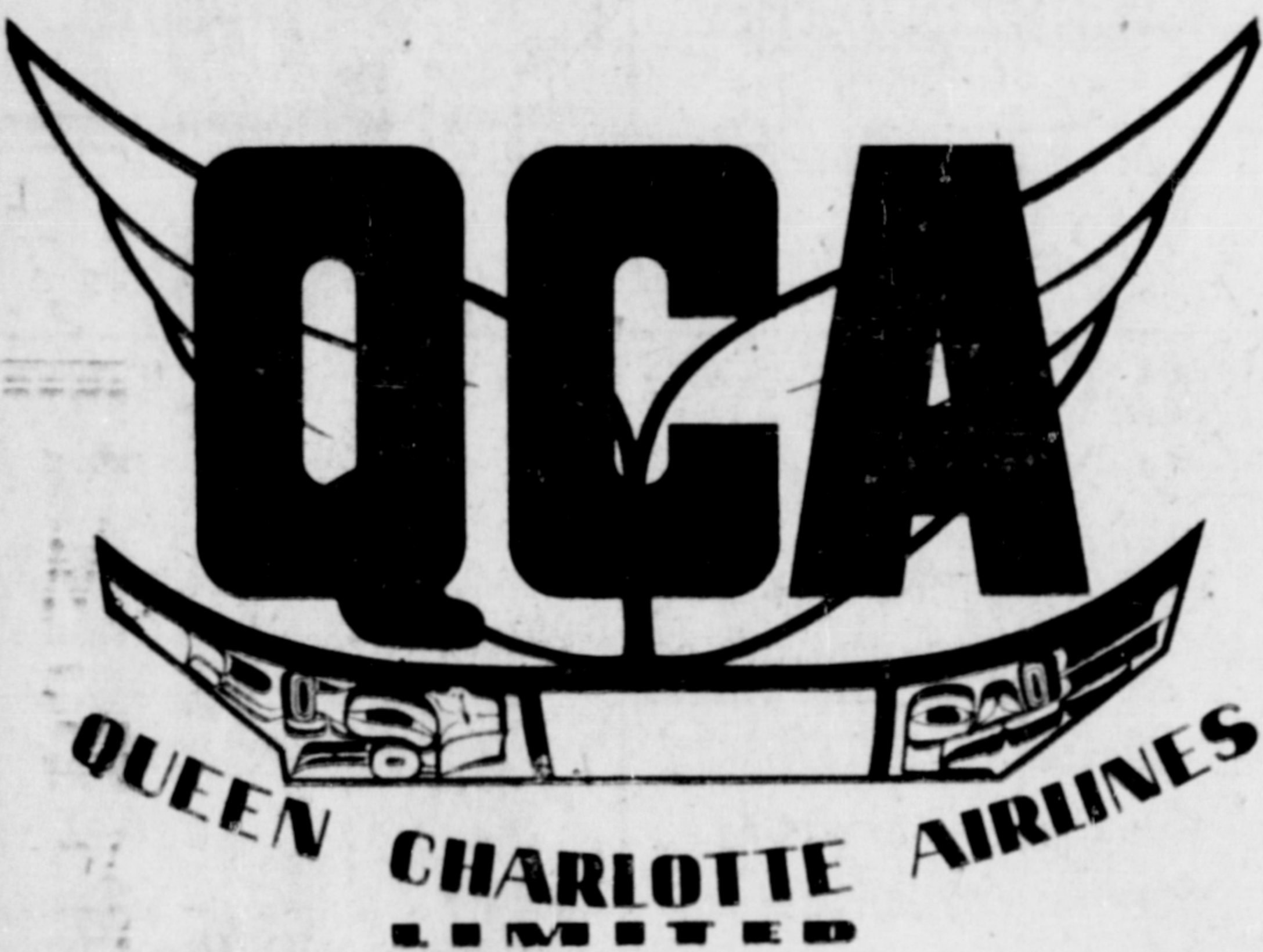

## SEASON OF HARVESTING

In the central British Columbia the season for harvesting grain and clover seed crops is very short. It is usually limited to the month of August and the first week or 10 days of September. During the remainder of September and October rainfall is high and temperatures are low. With the accompanying cloudy weather, drying is slow and difficult. Threshing during this period is slow and labor expensive. Losses from shattering and from sprouting are frequently excessive. Under such circumstances the cropping program should be planned in such a way that the job of harvesting coincides with the suitable weather as nearly as possible, says W. T. Burns, Dominion Experimental Station, Prince George.

There are a number of things that can be done to assist in accomplishing this objective and, at the same time, can be considered good cropping practice.

First of all the hay harvest should be completed early. Hay should be made during the early part of July to obtain good quality. Occasionally, due to weather conditions, it is necessary to delay the job. In no case should it be allowed to lap over into August and compete with the grain and clover seed harvest for time.

Clover seed crops should be cut as early as possible, so as to get good yields of high grade seed. After the first of August, cutting should be started as soon as the first ripened heads begin to drop. The clover seed should be cut not later than August 15.

Grain cutting should not be delayed. In an area such as Northern British Columbia it is not possible to wait until the seed is hard and the straw dry. In view of weather conditions it will usually be better to harvest when the seed is in the firm dough stage even though the stems contain considerable sap.

Another point of importance is to have all equipment thoroughly overhauled and repaired before it is needed. Mowers will need a complete checking over for knives, guards, bearings, etc. The binder should have the canvases, knife, rollers, knottor all checked for repairs and the thresher should be put in shape. It is wasteful to make such repairs after the crop is ready or to have a breakdown in the field.

In this district one must be ready for the harvest when it is ready. The season is too short for delays whatever the cause.

## Terrace Produce Is Trucked Here

Fine, clean full-headed cabbage and lettuce, free of blemish and beautifully graded, comprised the first commercial shipment of Terrace produce to be brought to the Prince Rupert market by truck over the highway which arrived on Tuesday afternoon. It was delivered by Lindsay Cartage and Storage which has instituted a regular trucking service between here and Terrace, carrying wholesale goods from here to the interior and planning to bring farm products as return loads. The shippers were Hamlin & Thomson of the well known Horseshoe Farm and the consignee, Ross Ingram's Fairway Market. William Gair was driver of the truck. Next week new potatoes from Terrace will be added to the list of produce being brought in.

## NEW GARAGE AT SMITHERS

SMITHERS—An addition is being built at Hoskins Garage in Smithers.
