A reserve of 25 per cent of canned milk has been established in Vancouver for young children.

## HOW CAN I ???

Q. How can I make stuffed onions?

A. Use Bermuda onions, hollowed out and steamed gently until almost tender. They are delicious when stuffed with chopped liver, highly seasoned, and baked for half an hour.

Q. How can I hasten the task of beating eggs?

A. Add a pinch of salt and the work will be accomplished in far less time than ordinarily.

Q. How can I remove stains from tinware?

A. Rub thoroughly with a damp cloth dipped in common soda. Follow this by washing and wiping dry.

## BORDEN STREET SCHOOL HAS NOTABLE PLACE IN JUNIOR RED CROSS LIST

Borden Street elementary school's contributions to the Junior Red Cross have earned it eleventh place in the list of B. C. schools which turned over money to the society during the 1945-46 school term.

During the term, Borden Street School turned over \$354.25 which was raised by the children, mainly through the redemption of tea and coffee coupons which they collected, to the Junior Red Cross. The school's position in the contribution list represents a notable achievement because every other school which made greater contributions also had a large enrolment.

There were 760 B.C. schools in the list of contributors, and the list totalled \$38,651.60.

The money was turned over to the B.C. Junior Red Cross for its Crippled and Handicapped Children's Fund, and to the National Junior Red Cross service. The latter sends food and clothing for needy children in war-devastated lands.

Leading the list of contributors was the Victoria High School, which with an enrolment of more than 1,200, turned over \$3,213 to the Junior Red Cross.

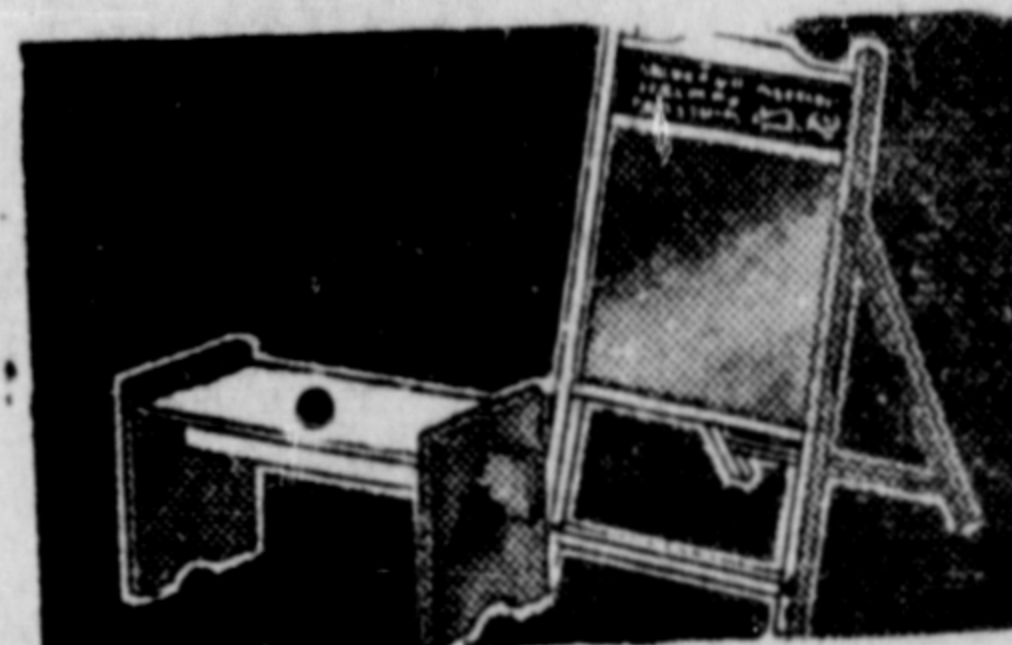
