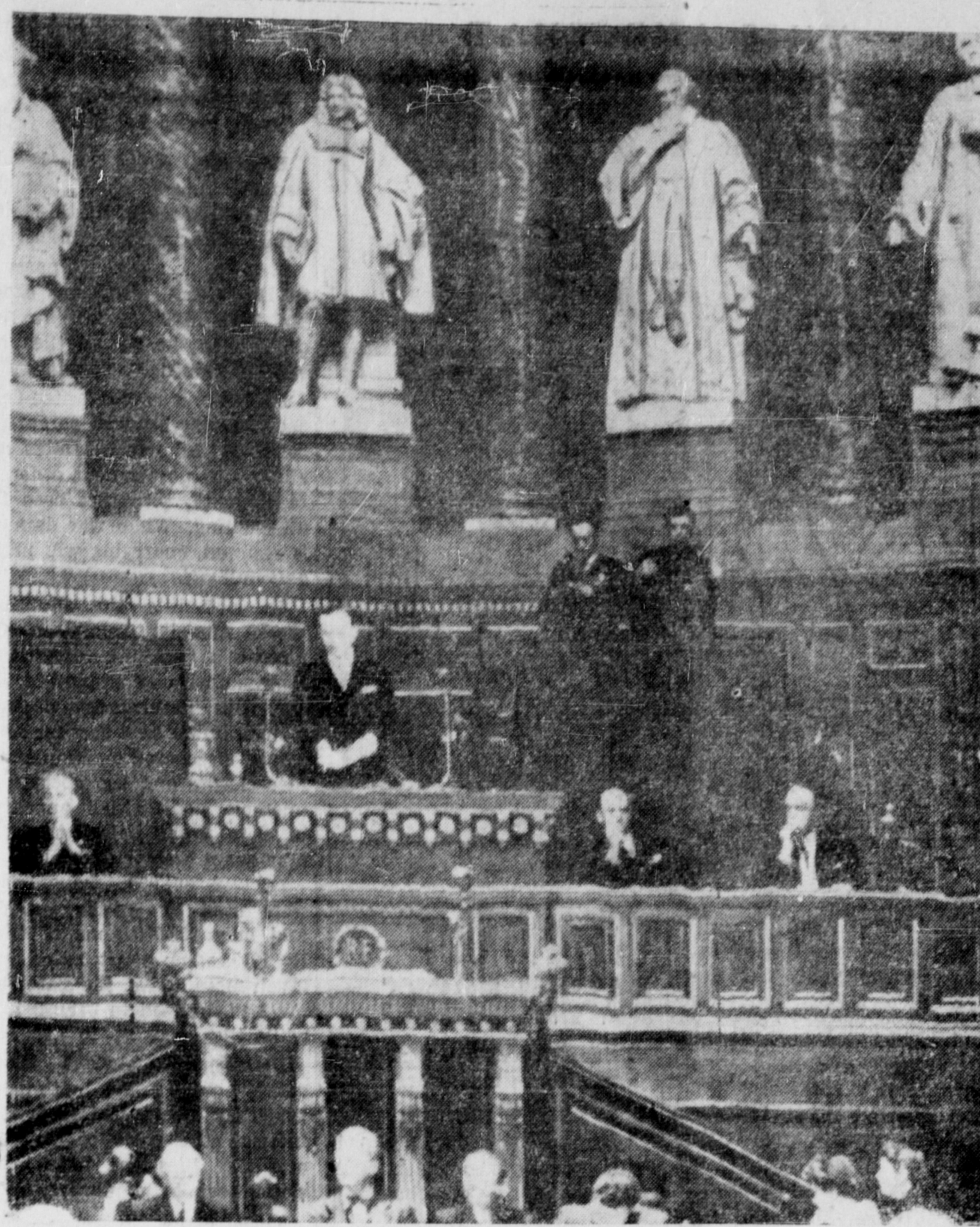

TRANSPORTATION CHIEF ON COAST

Stanley F. Dingle, C.N.R. Official, Speaks of Crop Carrying

VANCOUVER — On his first western tour since being promoted to the high and important post of Chief of Transportation, Canadian National Railways system, Stanley F. Dingle, of Montreal, is now visiting the Pacific Coast to meet with British Columbia district officers and re-familiarize himself with general conditions. Before his promotion, April 1, Mr. Dingle was general superintendent, Alberta District, C.N.R., Edmonton, for a year and a half.

Mr. Dingle stated here that the handling of the western wheat crop, in fact all crops throughout Canada, is a matter that is being given close attention by the C.N.R. at this time. Box cars, along with power, have been transferred from the central and Atlantic regions to augment the supply in the west. "C.N.R. supply will undoubtedly be hard pressed but, with the fullest utilization by all concerned, including the shippers, in prompt unloading and re-lease of cars, and loading to the fullest possible capacity in line with the Transport Controllers' orders, it is fully anticipated that all demands will be met," said Mr. Dingle.

GLACIERS CHANGING

Milwaukee Explorer Makes Interesting Discovery in Cariboo Range

WINNIPEG—Nature is about to reverse itself in the precipitous Cariboo Range adjacent to the Canadian National Railways in the interior of British Columbia, according to a Milwaukee attorney, Raymon T. Zillmer, who passed through here after completing his fourth, exploratory trip to determine the sources of three rivers which water a good share of the Pacific coast. They are the North Thompson, the Canoe and the McLennan.

Zillmer found that, due to exceptionally heavy snows last winter and an extraordinary amount of snow this summer, the glaciers which give rise to the trio of rivers are due to advance instead of retreat. He reported extreme difficulty scaling the glaciers because the snow was peeling off in resounding avalanches.

A member of the American and Canadian Alpine Clubs, Zillmer has done a pioneering job on the little-known Cariboo Range. He was accompanied by Joel North, prospector living at Valemount.
