U.S.S. TUCSON **VETERAN OF** PACIFIC WAR

Veteran of the sea war against Japan, the American light antiaircraft cruiser U.S.S. Tucson is due to arrive here at 7:30 tomorrow morning on a three-day visit which will keep her in port and for the dedication of Roosevelt Park on Monday. Under command of Capt.

Harry Sanders, Tucson is flagship of the United States Navy They were operating near an Pacific training command, and is now attached to the First Fleet, which conducted the atom bomb tests at Bikini atoll in

July. Commissioned February 3, 1945, Tucson served with the American Third Fleet in actions against Japan from July 10 to August 14, 1945 and entered Tokyo Bay as part of the covering force on

September 5 last year. In October she returned to the United States to become flagship of the Pacific training command. On her visit here she will carry a complement of approximately 25 officers and 350 enlisted personnel
