Waterfront Whiffs

Area No. Two Closing Monday—Steady Flow of Fish From Ketchikan

When Area Two is officially closed at midnight Monday it will mark the termination of the shortest and most intensively productive season from that area in the history of the halibut fishery. Halibut landings at Prince Rupert up to yesterday were greater by more than 300,000 pounds than those to June 11, 1945. Since the start of the 1946 season, 6,773,500 pounds have been brought to Prince Rupert while in the period from May 1 to June 11, 1945 the landings totalled 6,479,500. The scores of vessels which will head for this port from Area Two within the next few days will swell considerably the total.

United States and Canadian fleets landed 17,684,000 pounds of halibut in May from Area No. 1, northward from the Washington coast to Cape Spencer in southeast Alaska. The amount was three million pounds greater than last year in the same period.

Laden with fish, the 76-foot Co-op packer Kanawaka suffered mechanical difficulties Thursday between Naden Harbor and Seven Mile Point on the north coast of Graham Island but managed to limp into Naden Harbor to await a tow to Prince Rupert. Another Co-op packer, the 89-foot Hickey, was dispatched yesterday to bring the Kanawaka to port for repairs. The two boats arrived here this morning. Master of the Kanawaka is H. Marshall.

Union steamer Cassiar, Capt. Lorne Godfrey, arrived from Vancouver and the south islands Friday afternoon, sailing early this morning for Massett and Port Clements. She is expected back on her southbound trip on Sunday.

Landings here during the last week have been 1,214,500 pounds, of which 981,500 pounds were from Canadian boats and 233,000 American. The American landings for the season constitute about one-sixth of the total landed from regular halibut boats. Canadian boats have brought in 5,487,000 pounds, while 1,286,500 have been landed by American boats since May 1.

A fairly constant flow of frozen halibut is passing over the local C.N.R. wharf, arriving from Ketchikan by packer and being transferred to refrigerator cars for shipment to the United States. The Ketchikan packer Sydney has been bringing in between one and two cars almost daily.

In command of Capt. H. E. Neden, who arrived during the night with his crew of 28 from Vancouver aboard the Cardena, the second China coaster, Ottawa Paget, to be built at the local dry dock and which has now been sold to the Chinese government, sailed at noon for Vancouver. Capt. Neden a week ago took south the first of these vessels, Ottawa Pallette, which made the run to Vancouver in 48 hours and performed admirably. At Vancouver the vessels are being picked up by Chinese crews and delivered to the Orient.
