

Australian Girl Draws in Surgery

PERNBERA. — Pioneer in a phase of medical illustration, Flight Officer Coral Alldritt, W.A.A.F., is assisting the development of plastic surgery in Australia by making sketches of the performance of operations. She has had to evolve a technique for lightening, accurate sketches—nine or 10 to each operation—which record every vital movement of the surgeon's knife

Sketches are said to be better than photography because blood and other matter interfere with clarity in photographs. Part of Miss Alldritt's work involves building up of plaster casts of disfigured faces with plasticine to give the surgeon a guide in his work. After discharge from the W.A.A.F., Miss Alldritt hopes to take a course in medical illustration at the John Hopkins Medical University in Baltimore, U.S.A.

Irish Washerwomen Use Mine Casings

ROSSLARE HARBOR, Eire. — Dismantled sea mines—British and German—are being put to strange uses along the south coast of Eire, where during the war hundreds of them drifted ashore. Whoever reported a mine got the casing when the authorities had removed the explosives.
Now almost every other house along the 60 miles of coastline uses mines as water butts. In farm yards they have been converted into boilers for cattle food, chicken coops, rabbit hutches. Sometimes they are gaily painted and used to hold ornamental trees. In several instances they have become dog kennels and washing tubs.

HOW CAN I ???

Q. How can I clean a white felt hat?
A. By using one quart of cornmeal mixed with one cupful of salt and flour. Rub well into the surface of the hat, let it stand overnight, and then remove by brushing.

Q. How can I prevent nails or hooks from rusting when used for hanging damp towels, and such articles?
A. Paint the nails and hooks with white enamel, or any other color that will harmonize with the woodwork.

Q. How can I make a compound for cleaning marble?
A. Mix 2 parts of soda, 1 part pumice, and 1 part salt. Powder and mix to a paste with water. Then scour the marble.
