The time it takes to mature a crop depends somewhat on the variety grown. Most seed cataliogues give the maturity season for each variety. By sowing two varieties—one quick, and one slow-at the same time, longer harvest can be assured or the same result can be obtained by sowing the same variety twice, with an interval between sow-
