HAYSPORT FERRY

Editor, Daily News:
It has been suggested that Tyece on the Skeena River is more convenient than Haysport for a ferry float and that the float may be moved from the latter place to Tyece.

The residents of Port Essington and district, including Carlisle, do not want the float moved to Tyece. Haysport, which is the fishing boundary, is used extensively by fishermen and fish packers who find the present location very serviceable. If the float is moved to Tyece these men will be deprived of a handy place to tie up their boats as Tyece is three miles inside the fishing boundary.

On some occasions during the past season there were as many as 30 fishing boats tied to the Haysport float. The fishermen on these boats should not be expected to buck a seven-knot tide to land at Tyece, a distance of three miles.

The present ferryman, who also carries the mail from Haysport to Port Essington, says Tyece is no place for a ferry float, as ice conditions would sometimes prevent him making a landing.

Bishop Sees More Mining

Resumption of Activity in Various Parts of Yukon Predicted by Geddes

The tide of mining activity in the Yukon is expected to start rolling upward after having experienced during the years of war the lowest ebb it has sustained in decades, it was said yesterday by Rt. Rev. W. A. Geddes, Anglican Bishop of the Yukon, who was in the city yesterday morning aboard the Princess Norah returning to his ecclesiastical seat at Dawson after a three-months absence outside. He spent most of the time at Vancouver where Mrs. Geddes and family are at present in residence, also attending a church conference in Toronto in November. He will fly in from Whitehorse to Dawson. While here he met Rt. Rev. J. B. Gibson, Bishop of Caledonia.

Bishop Geddes said that a new company has become interested in the lode mining at Mayo on the Stewart River east of Dawson and its presence is expected to be accompanied by a sharp resumption of productive activity in that silver and gold field. Likewise there is expected to be a fillip of activity in the "Sixty Mile" country, west of Dawson near the Alaska boundary. A placer dredge which was taken in to Dawson in 1941 but never got any further than there is expected to be delivered over the road to "Sixty Mile" this season.

Considerable attention in the way of opening up is expected to be paid to the Carmacks area between Whitehorse and Dawson where a new gold discovery was made last year. The Yukon was one of these formerly active mineral areas of the north which suffered a slump during the war owing to shortage of manpower and lack of interest in the production of precious metals not vitally essential to the war effort.
