STEWART NEWS

Latest from Portland Canal Mining Centre

FEELS OVER STRIKE SITUATION; MUCH ACTIVITY IN REAL ESTATE

There had been some nervousness that a projected strike of the miners might extend to the Portland Canal district, affecting more especially the Premier mine. However, there now seems to be a feeling of confidence that it may be settled before being actually precipitated. A strike would be a serious blow for this camp as it is just about to embark on what is expected to be a new era of activity and prosperity.

There has been considerable activity recently in the transfer of real estate in Stewart. One of the most recent deals was the purchase by J. O. LeFrancois of Montreal of the two-storey garage building on Fifth Street from Mrs. Kasper, now of Prince Rupert.

Most of the machinery and equipment having now been delivered in the spectacular transportation undertaking over Salmon River glacier, work is now proceeding on the Salmon Gold property, far up the Salmon River valley. Another large compressor arrived on the last boat enroute to the property and another tractor has also been delivered. Evan Harris is directing operations.

The annual meeting of the Stewart Board of Trade was held on Thursday last in the Union Hall. W. R. Tooth, chairman of the village commissioners, presided over the meeting with A. Russworm, secretary. In a few brief remarks Mr. Tooth welcomed those present and explained that the secretary and himself had endeavoured to keep the organization going during the quiescent period caused by the war. Officers were elected and plans made for revival of activities.

The Crawford Transfer Company is putting in a hardware department and has carpenters, painters and decorators busily engaged making the necessary alterations to the premises. Mr. Crawford has also purchased the Dann property on the corner of Columbia and Fourth Streets.

The weather has been very warm, not to say hot, with the thermometer registering 80 degrees in the shade, however the evenings are cool.

Mr. Rochfort and Mr. Davidson are directors of the company. The various properties were visited, Dunwell as well as others. Work will be concentrated meanwhile on Silverado.
