PIONEERS' HOME IS SATISFACTORY

Reports to the Contrary Unjustifiable, City Council Committee Finds

The Pioneers' Home, occupying temporary quarters in the old Army barracks on Sixth Avenue West pending the new home in Westview being ready for occupancy, is being conducted in a proper manner, the elderly men are being well provided for and everything is entirely satisfactory.

Such was the report presented to the city council last night by Ald. Nora Arnold, chairman of the relief committee, with corroboration of other members of the committee who paid a surprise visit to the home on Sunday after some complaints had been made as to conditions there. Such complaints were entirely unjustified, said Ald. Arnold.

Meals were substantial and well prepared. The place was warm and the men well dressed. The storeroom was well stocked with clothing. Only one complaint was heard, that being of a guest from out of town who made an objection as to a deduction from his old age pension check.

Ald. George Hills said the present Home was "very good," considering the premises were only temporary.

Ald. C. G. Ham and Mayor H. M. Daggett concurred in the report.
