Manners, posture, carriage, dress and grooming are taught in a four-weeks' lecture course at the school. While attending the school they are expected to put the teachings into practice. They must wear stockings and gloves, shoes with heels, and hats instead of bandanas.

Veils on the girls' hats are taboo, because that is "strictly glamor dress," says an official, Their shoes must be conservative-not open-toed, or openand not having too many straps, or fancy trimming.


