HOW CAN I ???

Q. How can I make a good paint remover?
A. Dissolve 20 parts of caustic soda (98 per cent) in 100 parts of water, mix this with 20 parts of mineral oil, and stir constantly until thoroughly mixed. Then add while stirring, 20 parts of sawdust, and if possible pass this solution through a paint mill, to get a uniform mixture. Apply the paste moist.

Q. How can I remove tartar from the teeth?
A. Lemon juice will remove tartar, but the juice should be removed thoroughly after the cleansing by rinsing with lukewarm water, as acids are injurious to the teeth.

Q. How can I make glass opaque?
A. Rub it with a lump of putty. Apply evenly and carefully, rubbing only one way.

FRANK WARNE TRANSFERRED

Fisheries Official Moved—Ingvold Urseth Successor

Announcement was made at the local Fisheries Department office this morning that Frank Warne, Fisheries inspector here, is to be transferred to Vancouver to take the position of assistant chief supervisor at the Vancouver office under Chief Supervisor J. A. Motherwell. Mr. Warne's position here will be filled by Ingvold Urseth, inspector of the Bella Bella district. The changes are effective at the end of January.

Mr. Warne will fill the position left open by the transfer of T. Taylor to be supervisor of the New Westminster office of the department. Replacing Mr. Urseth at Bella Bella will be R. C. Edwards, inspector of the Bella Coola area.

With the departure of Mr. Warne Prince Rupert will lose a resident of more than 20 years standing. He has been attached to the fisheries office in Prince

Ingvold Urseth, fisheries inspector at Bella Bella, is leaving Friday for the Cardena to return to the south after spending a few days in the city on official business.

The Experts Say - -

KEEP ON SAVING — During the last few years we've learned a lot about saving... saving sugar, saving butter, saving and stretching meat and all the other foods that are either rationed or scarce.

All this, and many other war-acquired food skills, have led to considerable money saving too and here's a thought for the new year: continue to save money on food bills to help feed Europe's peoples to whom our somewhat restricted diet looks like a feast.

To help along this saving campaign the following are suggested ways to make a little food go a long way:

First of all, saving by not buying too much—that is, too much of certain foods which are perishable. These include lettuce, celery and other salad makings which will wilt if you haven't proper storage space, and root vegetables and fruits which will shrivel for the same reason.

Then there's the saving of flavor in spices. Yes, pure natural spices have been hard to get but any spice, whether pure or synthetic, will lose its flavor if exposed to the air too long. Be sure always to close the opening of your spice tin and if you have the shaker type of container, keep a little round of waxed paper over the shaker opening.

PRECIOUS APPLES — Having mentioned the question of fruits, let's go back and see what we can do about those precious apples. There are many ways of stretching the apple flavor in salads and desserts. This may be done by reducing the usual amount of apple in a cabbage and apple salad, in gelatine desserts, in Apple Betty, in Dutch Apple Cake... in fact in any recipe using apples.

Dutch Apple Cake requires two cups of flour, three teaspoons of baking powder, one egg, one large or two medium apples, 1/2 teaspoon of salt, 1/4 cup of butter, 2/3 cup of milk, two tablespoons of sugar, 1/4 teaspoon of cinnamon.

Mix and sift the dry ingredients except the sugar and cinnamon. Cut or rub in the butter, add the milk and beaten egg gradually. Spread 1/2 inch thick on a shallow buttered pan. Pare, cut the apples in sections lengthwise, and set in dough; sprinkle the top with sugar and cinnamon, bake in a hot oven, 400 degrees fahrenheit, 25 to 30 minutes. Serve with cream.
