## NOT MOVING GERMANS YET

Still Uncertain as to When Canada Will Ship Prisoners Of War Home

OTTAWA (P)-The question of when Canada is going to get rid of the 35,060 German prisoner, of war held in this country has come up again. The question was brought up by two newspapers -the Montreal Star and the

Vancouver Province. The first news story came out of Montreal. It declared that Phone Red 389 sailing of the Germans had been cancelled indefinitely including the departure of 10,000 scheduled to sail from Halifax one week from today. It was added that the prisoners all likely would be out of the Dominion by summer.

The Vancouver paper later came out with a similar story. However, government statements squashed all the stories. Movement of the prisoners, say these informants, still is in the discussion stage among British and Canadian authorities over-
