SEEK TRUTH ON RUMORS ABOUT SHIP BUILDING

Delegates to Prince Rupert Labor-Progressive Council meeting Saturday warned against any abatement of the campaign to win ship contracts for the local dry dock on the basis of rumors of possible future contracts.

"Either the rumors are true or they are not true," stated Chairman Doris Blakey. "If they are true then the announcement of the C.N.'s intentions should be

made in unequivocal terms so the people here will know where they stand. If they are not true then it signifies that they are originated with a purpose of discrediting the strong local campaign for contracts. In either case, renewed strong representations would seem appropriate."

The council decided to dispatch a letter to Finance Minister J. L. Isley at Ottawa protesting the easing of price ceilings on 300 items and the announced prospect of further removals of ceilings on other goods. "It would be shameful," the letter declared in part, "after Canada's magnificent fight against inflation throughout the

war, to surrender to the pressure of the minority who want wholly-unjustified increases in order to swell their already swollen profits as revealed in government figures. Such a move can only bring great hardship to the working people of Canada since it will likely result within the coming period in a general 25 per cent increase in the cost of living."
