WORKERS—Work at Duthie is progressing with Col. C. Smith in charge of operations. A contract has been let by the Bros., diamond drillers, for 300 feet of drilling and this has increased at a later date. Sixty men are drilling at the mine.

Workers have been inspected and it is expected that the power will be in operation in six weeks and work can go ahead on the McPherson. The last two miles and up to the mine was in shape but this is being repaired by government road men. The total number of men now working at the mine is 26.
