LYNN PATRICK—Lynn Patrick, veteran star who was appointed Manager-Coach of the New Haven Ramblers this season, was rated one of the greatest forwards in the game when he enlisted in the United States Army in 1943. Two full seasons off skates—the boys in Uncle Sam's forces never got a chance to play hockey, most of them being miles from rinks—proved to be a task for the fleet-footed forward to overcome and he plans to play only when forced to do so by injuries to his players. The Ramblers had played only two games this season when Lynn was forced to don his skates, but he welcomed the opportunity to retire again to the bench when help arrived. Lynn comes from a great hockey family. In addition to Lester, his Uncle Frank, was one of hockey's brightest stars. As playing-manager of the Vancouver Millionaires, Frank led them to the Stanley Cup. He later managed Montreal Canadiens, Boston Bruins and was managing director of the N.H.L. Lynn was born in Victoria, B.C., February 3, 1912, weighs 210 and is 6 ft. 1 inch tall. He is married and the father of two boys.

TO NATURALIZE ENEMY ALIENS

Australia to Admit Them To Citizenship

CANBERRA, A.—Some of the 2,000 persons interned in Australia during the war as enemy aliens or merely for precautionary reasons will be permitted to become naturalized Australians.

Before naturalization papers are granted in any case, a year's probationary term will have to be served. Once naturalization is complete, the former internees will be permitted to bring their families to Australia.

Naturalization will be permitted on the recommendation of a special commission which might also recommend deportation or release pending deportation. The naturalization plan was decided upon because of the difficulty of repatriation due to shipping restrictions as well as

of the difficulty of re-settlement in devastated homelands. The plan will not apply to 18,000 enemy prisoners of war, mostly Italians, a few of whom have already started for home.
