swallow up death in victory; and the Lord wipe away tears from off all faces." Isa. 25:8.

all more or less confronted with the specter of international unrest, suspicion, fear of the near future and general uncertainty today. But we are also confronted on the other hand with two absolute certainties—death and the life of human happiness, and victory over death—through Jesus Christ for all who put their trust in Him.

To most folk, death is a grim reality—a reality that is not contemplated with any source of pleasure but rather apprehension, dread and fear—a fear that arises from the fact of being unprepared for the uninvited intruder into life with its activities.

This stern reaper who seems to strike with such an unerring accuracy, makes himself felt from time to time in any community and, eventually, in every home. Each time he appears, his very presence is a forceful reminder that all men will some day be his victim. A reminder that all men, therefore, need to prepare themselves for the inevitable.

How strange then that so many seem to let warning after warning pass unheeded. Too often, because of procrastination, men find themselves quite unready for the unwelcome guest. But why should men go through this life without insuring themselves against this eternal loss? God has freely provided for each one of us, through His grace, that we might have eternal life through Jesus Christ the Lord.

Our text clearly sets before us the welcome news that the Lord will swallow up death in victory and, in Paul's epistle to the Corinthians, we read a like statement in these words, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" and again, "But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Elsewhere in this same chapter we find the following inspired words: "For He must reign, until He hath put all enemies under His feet. The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death." Hence in Christ Jesus, and in Him alone is there true security against this common foe of man.

Believing the inspired Word of God, let us then unreservedly turn to Jesus and in Him find Salvation both for time and eternity.

Let us thus fortify ourselves against the day when death comes so that it may not be said of us "we were unprepared." May the parable of the Ten Virgins serve as an ample warning to each one of us against neglect, in this all important matter.

Remember! death is a certainty, but so is Christ's Salvation from its power. Two absolute certainties!

CHURCH OPPOSES SUNDAY BATHING

BLOEMFONTEIN, S. A. — The Dutch Reformed Church here believes that Sunday bathing at their pleasure resort of Mazelspoort, near the city, is a menace. The Synodal Commission of the church is expected to make strong representations to the city council to put a ban on Sunday swimming at the resort. It believes that Sunday bathing is a "social evil." One member of the Dutch Reformed Church declared: "Mazelspoort is a menace to the morals of our young people. We want to take them out of the swimming pool and get them into the church pews where they belong, on the Sabbath. For young men and women to strut around together in the state of semi-nudity provided by modern bathing costumes is bad enough at any time, but to do it on a Sunday is sacrilege. We must put a stop to it."
