**EVACUATE BOATS  
2000 YEARS OLD**

TRIAL, F.R.—Plank boats  
2,000 years old, imbedded in the  
mud of the Humber River when  
Julius Caesar landed in Britain,  
are being excavated under the  
tender care of scientists. Efforts  
are being made to dig out the  
boats in a solid block of clay and

haul them to dry ground on a  
steel sled. The planks are fast-  
ened with yew withies counter-  
sunk to avoid wear. Possibly the  
boats were paddled.  
About 30 feet of one boat re-  
mains and the other is some 37  
feet long. Scientists said the dis-  
covery was of "great importance  
in the history of European  
water transport."
