This was about 50 feet from shore and it was at that stage that Balfour finally succumbed to exhaustion and, despite Dell's efforts to rescue him, sank. Dell himself, after the harrowing experience, admits that he hardly remembers what happened or how he managed to save his own life. Bruises, cuts and scratches substantiate his statement that he was thrown ashore by the tempest rather than swimming.

**No More "Packing" Aboard Troopships**

LONDON, (C)—Complaints of "sardine-packing" on British troopships should be heard no more if the War Office acts on the report of a special committee and streamlines its troopships. Seeking ways of improving upon the 27,000-ton Georgic, former Cunard White Star trans-Atlantic liner and now its latest trooper, the War Office recently assigned a team to accompany her on a trooping mission to Bombay and back. Their reports are being studied. The Georgic was refitted for her task after burning out at Suez in 1941 and already offers individual fold-up berths for every soldier, movie theatres, recreation rooms, large mess halls and cafeterias. She is air-conditioned throughout and wired for public-address systems

**IMMIGRATION IS ADVOCATED**

Showing of Film and Resultant Discussion Results in Message to Ottawa

Showing of the film "This is Our Canada" before a gathering in the Civic Centre Wednesday night inspired a round table discussion which resulted in a missive being sent to the Secretary of State at Ottawa advocating a policy of immigration to people the great virgin country of Canada. Foreign immigrants, however, it is being suggested, should be required to have a basic knowledge of the English language and should receive education in citizenship after they arrive here.

The meeting recorded itself as being opposed to the setting up of isolated colonies of any particular type of nationals.

Canadians, it was stressed in the discussion, should have pride and make it known in the communities, the provinces and the nation.

There were about 40 persons—youth and not so young—present and the discussion was led by Harold Box of Quesnel, National Film Board representative.





**SKILLED DIVERS FISH FOR SHELLS**

BRISBANE, Australia, (C)—Trochus-shell fishing is in full swing again along the 1,200-mile Great Barrier Reef, off the east coast of Queensland State. Native divers working from small boats, before the war, gathered about \$60,000 worth of trochus-shell which contains mother-of-pearl. The cone-shaped shell is found on coral beds and among the atolls of the Barrier Reef and the diving season is suspended only from December to March when heavy seas and storms interfere. This year trochus-shell is plentiful because the reefs were untouched during the war. The beds were becoming depleted at the outbreak of war and Japanese fishermen who had no scruples about taking quick hauls of shells of all ages and sizes were partly blamed.
