It has been announced by Pacific Mills Limited that Miss La Verne Veima Stables of Ocean Falls, is the winner of their \$250 annual scholarship, being offered this year for the first time. This scholarship is open to the sons and daughters of employees of Pacific Mills Limited and is awarded to the eligible student obtaining the highest average marks in any year in the written examinations of the scholarship subjects required for the University of B.C. Entrance qualifications.  
Miss Stables won this scholarship with an average of 86.2 percent.

Her father, Norman Stables, is superintendent of the sulphite mill. In a careless moment he offered his daughter one hundred dollars if she could win the Pacific Mills Scholarship. **BOAT PLANT IS VISITED**  
In pursuance of their policy of making themselves acquainted with local industrial activities and employment possibilities therein the local employment advisory committee visited the McLean boatbuilding establishment last evening. Later they met in regular session.  
Members of the committee were impressed with the commodious quarters of this old-established firm. Facilities for accommodation of all sizes of fishing boats, including marine, railway and cradle, overhead space for masts, launching and repairing, varied equipment available, all were examined with interest. The spacious accommodation for moorage in well-sheltered location made the claim that there was not sufficient anchorage space available for local fishing fleet seems very flimsy. Examples of large repair jobs were also in evidence. This is a local industry that many citizens who do not visit the east end are not acquainted with.  
The business session followed at the Unemployment Insurance Commission office.
