rather than along the coast and that she would try to get booster equipment installed along this line. While in Ottawa, she would see about it.

A letter from Victoria with regard to a recent request to have the Kalum Road be made into a number two highway stated the government has no control over the territory beyond 30 feet on either side of the road. The suggestion was being made to the Public Works Department that this area be cleared immediately so that the part adjacent to the road could dry out.


