## Community Enterprise Is Being Watched by Cities Throughout the Dominion

Prince Rupert's program of community-sponsored recreation is being watched keenly by many towns and cities in British Columbia and other parts of Canada. As a recreation enterprise it is unique in that it is being run and financed not only for the citizens but by the citizens with only minor financial outside help.

Not only is Rup-Rec outstanding in this regard but so is the Civic Centre organization, which, with a courage which makes some cautious local souls shiver, has undertaken to finance and operate one of the largest community buildings of its kind in the Dominion. .

This combination of organizations, Rup-Rec and Civic Centre, destined to eventually become a single working organization geared to the recreational and cultural needs of the community. is creating history.

The fact that both the Civic Centre and Rup-Rec are purely citizens' programs which sprang "from the grassroots" and have blossomed into powerful progressive movements is a tribute to the independent spirit of this.

"The work of the Recreational Council in Prince Rupert has put the city in the spotlight," said an observer recently. "It is being watched closely by other towns which are developing recreational activities. Rup-Rec is distinctive in that it is purely a citizens' movement and is recognized as such."



Sometimes during that 20year interval, it is true, the plan seemed dormant, but it sprang to life periodically, and seven years ago the people of the city took hold of the idea vigorously. developing the preparedness both financial and moral, which is a strong factor in enablin; them to take over the present fine, war-constructed building.

Leadership in the community centre idea was undertaken originally by the city's two senior service clubs, Gyro and Rotary, which back in 1925 started a program to raise money for a \$50,-000 Y.M.C.A. building. The plan never succeeded in its original form but the money raised by both clubs, assisted by other organizations, today is part of the Civic Centre fund which may be required for permanent acquisition of the present day commun-
