CHICAGO, Ill.—Saturday still is tops for bath night, according to numbers attending the 18 municipal bathhouses in Chicago. Surveys indicate that of the 500,000 patrons they expect this year, about a quarter of them will appear on Saturday. An institution of the Windy City since the 90's, they are operated free with a 5-cent fee if the bather wants soap and towel. Most of the bathhouses—each is equipped with 22 shower units—are in old neighborhoods where a private bathtub is a rare and lovely thing. 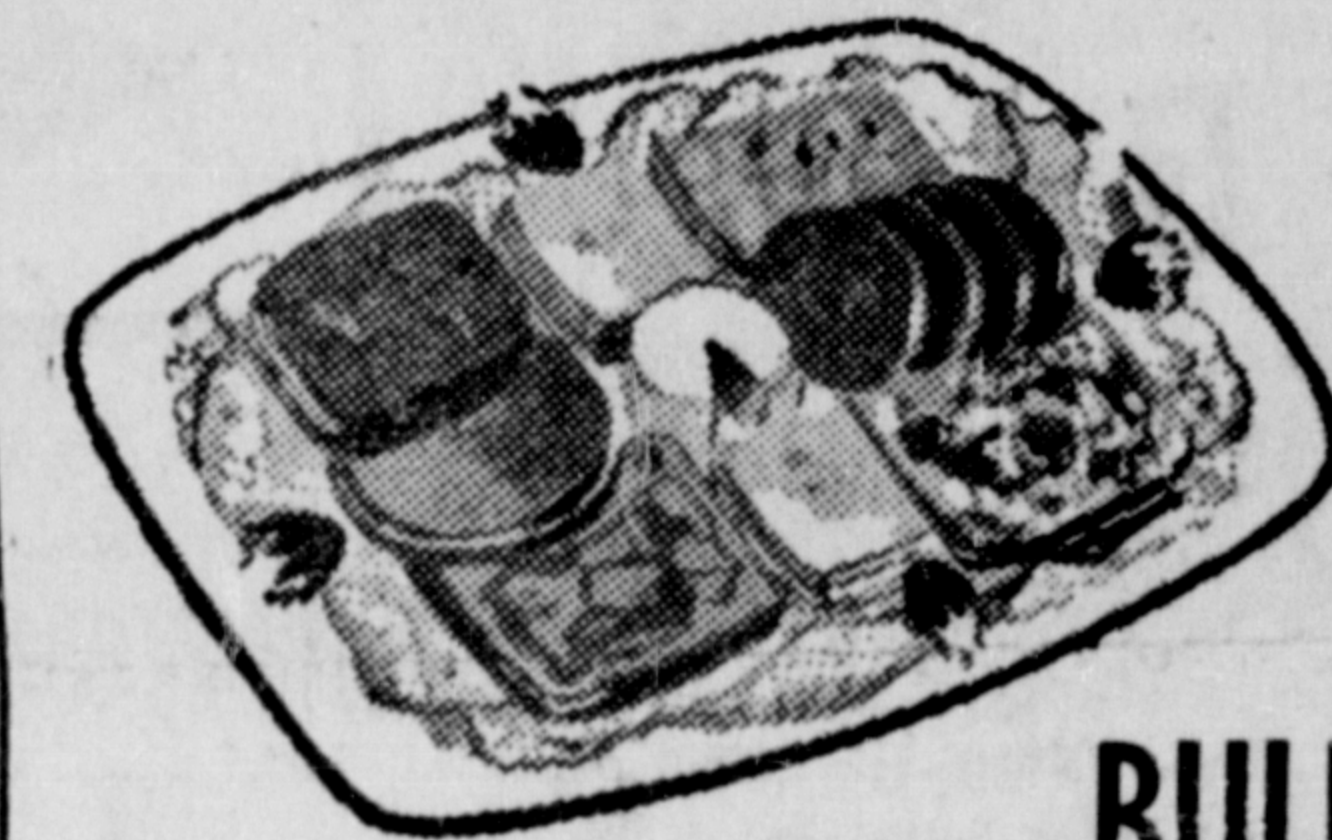
