TWO MORE VETS BUY CITY LOTS

Two more Prince Rupert veterans have taken advantage of the opportunity to purchase city owned lots at half their assessed value in order to build homes. Original sale agreement is for the full value of the lots, subject, however, to a rebate of 50 per cent providing a start is made at home construction by the purchaser within a year.

Buyers of adjoining properties of 37 1/2-foot frontage on Fourth Avenue East between Young and Cotton Streets are Earl Gordon, who bought lot 3 and the west half of lot 4, block 4, section 6 for \$787.50, and T. A. Johnston, who bought lot 5 and the east half of lot 4, in the same block and section for a similar amount.

Approval of the purchases of the city-owned property was made last night by City Council on recommendation of the finance committee.

Also approved was the sale of lots 9 and 10, block 13, section 1—on First Avenue between First and Second Streets—to A. E. Ferguson for \$390.
