This year, the game branch is asking greatly increased estimates and higher bounties on predatory animals and the estimates are now before the cabinet, he continued.

Mr. Cunningham had a word warning about bounties. He said that to raise them too high would be to invite bootlegged pelts being imported from other provinces and states, an experience suffered by the game department several years ago.

He said that 90 per cent of the bounties on predators were claimed by agriculturalists and 10 per cent by sportsmen, yet sportsmen paid 100 per cent of

the cost of predator control. Last year, he said, was the poorest year on record for duck hunting for reasons which game men were unable to explain.
