Good companions for it would be hot scones and a crisp cabbage salad. Steak and kidney pie on Wednesday is an excellent dish to tastefully and nutritiously satisfy winter appetites. For Thursday, plump frankfuriors, along with sauerkraut and jacket boiled potatoes, are suggested for appealing thrift. And on Friday unrationed fish, done to your liking, will bring the goodness of the sea to your table. A flank steak encircling a savoury dressing will take care of Saturday's dinner. I should leave you with a comforting something to tuck away in the ice box. You may care to devote the remaining token of the week to 6 ounces of cooked meais for luncheon menus, or to dugment the cold sliced flank steak for Sunday supper.
