LOSES COUNT  
OF HIS SONS

Most Important Absolute Monarch Has Many Children

CAIRO, (AP)—Ibn Saud, self-made king of Saudi Arabia, is, at 65, the most important absolute monarch alive and the ruler of the largest Arab nation since Mohammed the First. He has power of life and death over 5,000,000 subjects, will stand for no press—free or otherwise—puritanically opposes smoking, drinking, and gambling, and has seen to it that the ubiquitous motion picture has not penetrated his domain.

He has used religion as a political instrument and lives up to the letter of the Koran. Annually in a procession strange to the occidental eye he sets out for Mecca with his courtiers, cooks, sheiks, wives, ex-wives, servants and grandchildren. No accurate census of his offspring

Scot Trains Poles  
In Art of Bagpipes

EDINBURGH, Scotland. — The Piobaireachd Society of Scotland helped train 93 Canadian Army pipers given at Edinburgh Castle. Pipe Major William Ross, M.B.E., noted Scottish bagpipe instructor, taught 713 pipers from British Dominions and even Polish forces during the last six years. Canadians who attended more than one course on the finer points of piobaireachd included Pipe Majors Esson, Vancouver; Neil Sutherland and Malcolm MacKinnon, Calgary, and Sgt. Armstrong, all of the Seaforth Highlanders of Canada; Pipe Major D. Sutherland, Canadian Black Watch; Pipe Majors Duncan and Scott, Cameron Highlanders of Ottawa and Pipe Major Noble, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders of Canada.

In an interview two and a half years ago he asserted: "I know of nothing that justifies the Jewish claims in Palestine." One other statement regarding Palestine and the Jews was in reference to the British promise after the last war that there would be a Jewish home in the Holy Land. "That," snapped Saud, "is about as realistic as a promise by an Arab government to found a Jewish home in Devonshire."

"Since Jerusalem always has been a Moslem Holy Land as well as a Jewish and Christian one, Arabs wonder why Palestine was not the least suitable rather than the most suitable spot on the globe for such a venture."

California Olive  
Trees for Australia

SYDNEY, Australia. — Olive trees do well in Australia but in the past they have grown too slowly for the Australian orchardist to bother much about them. In 1939 Australia produced 18,000 gallons of olive oil, almost all in South Australia, and imported 360,000 gallons from Spain, Italy and France. Now George Warner, a plant-breeder of Pasadena, California, is applying in Australia a formula which is said to have produced in California olive-bearing trees 14 feet high from year-old slips within three years. Warner is working with Harold Drake of Sydney who is setting out 30,000 olive trees on 500 acres at Robinvale on the Murray River in Victoria. The Commonwealth Department of Agriculture has sponsored Warner's visit to Australia. It is hoped that Australia may grow all her own olives and make her own olive oil within five years. The oldest fruit-tree still alive in Australia is a 154-year-old olive in front of the oldest house in Australia—Elizabeth Farm at Parramatta, N.S.W., built in 1793.

PLAN MORE ROOM  
LONDON. — Improved standards for new permanent houses have been laid down by Hon. Aneurin Bevan, Britain's minister of health. A three-bedroom house for five people must now have a minimum range of 900 square feet—100 square feet more than was average in pre-war days. Other types of houses are to be on a proportionate scale.
