Chamber of Commerce Not In Favor of Proposing It to City Council

When the question of daylight saving was raised at the monthly meeting of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce last night by W. J. Scott, who advocated that it be adopted here for the summer, the members of the Chamber divided, a show of hands indicating eight members in favor and ten against.

Mr. Scott's proposal was that the city council be asked to go into the matter of instituting the summer time here. The proposal was voted down so will go no further.

Mayor H. M. Daggett recently announced that it was not the intention of the city to institute daylight saving here.

### RAILWAYMAN IS RETIRING

**Norman Card, Division Freight Agent at Winnipeg, Rounds Out Career**

WINNIPEG — Completing 47 years of service to railway transportation life of Canada, Norman Card, division freight agent, Canadian National Railways, with headquarters at Winnipeg, has retired at his own request. Mr. Card entered railway service in 1899. He will continue to reside in Winnipeg for the time being. Starting as a clerk in the yard office of the Grand Trunk Railway in Hamilton, Mr. Card served there for some time and later in Toronto where he became chief record clerk in 1904. In 1908 he moved westward and became chief clerk and agent in the Port Arthur office.

In 1912 Mr. Card moved to Vancouver where he was city freight agent and returned to Winnipeg in 1915 as travelling freight agent. In 1923 he was appointed division freight agent in Port Arthur, a position he held for six years, returning to Winnipeg in 1929.

Mr. Card is particularly well known in railway transportation circles and intimately connected with the business life of the city.
