 master resolution of the whole
 convention."
 In conceding that the measure
 was indeed farsighted, Dr. R. W.
 Alward favored the provincial
 government being kept minded
 of its obligations.
 Further discussion resulted in
 a decision to embody both mea-
 sures in an all-embracing resolu-
 tion, as follows:
 "Whereas there remains only
 approximately 80 miles of new
 construction, between Sinclair
 Mills and McBride, to complete
 the Northern Trans-Provincial
 Highway; and
 "Whereas the construction of
 this link will open up a large
 agriculture area as well as serve
 a great lumber industry and af-
 ford connection with the Jasper-
 Edmonton Highway, the Jasper-
 Banff Highway, the Big Bend
 Highway, the Cariboo Highway
 and the Peace River Highway,
 thereby increasing to an enor-
 mous extent the possibilities of
 the tourist industry from all
 parts of Canada and the United
 States, and creating new oppor-
 tunities for employment; and
 "Whereas, a portion of the



sources of Canada and especially
 in central and northern British
 Columbia; and
 "Whereas the heavy cost of
 governmental operations and
 services with its consequent high
 taxation bears too heavily upon
 the productive and consuming
 resources of our people that can
 be eased by increased productiv-
 ity necessitates greater effi-
 ciency, higher skills and more
 especially an increased popula-
 tion who will also increase con-
 sumption;
 "Therefore be it resolved, that
 the convention—recommends
 the early resumption of an im-
 migration policy, with special
 consideration of the admittance
 to Canada of relatives of Cana-
 dian citizens and of those people
 who were associated with Canada
 in the war."

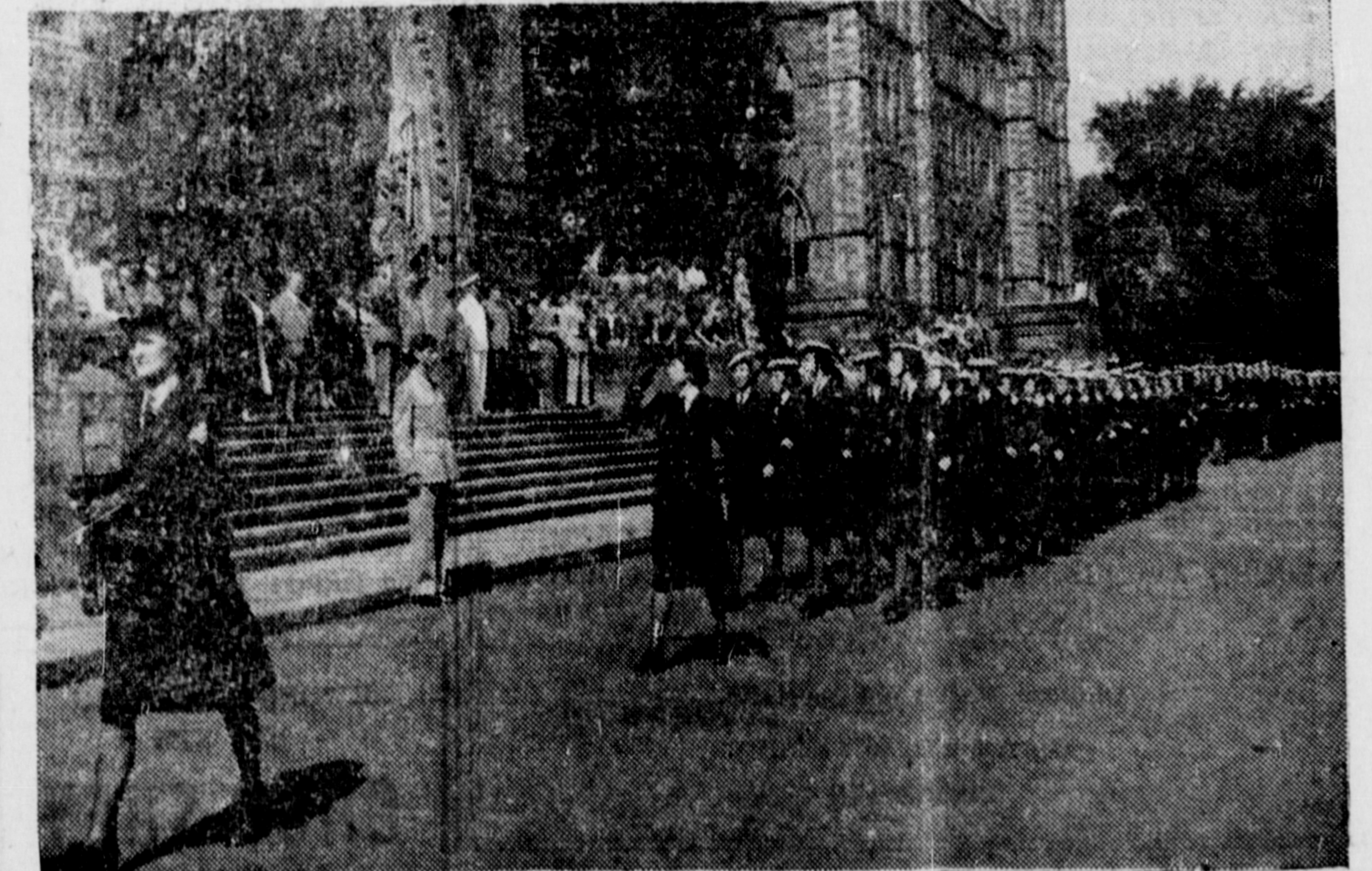
