How does the banking system operate?

Russia has a state bank called the "Gosbank" which has more than 300 branches. Among its numerous functions, the "Gosbank":

Receives taxes and other revenues; prints the money and operators too much emphasis mints the coin, although but little of the latter is now being done; floats state loans; grants credits of a special nature; holds reserves of foreign currencies.





