Many Firms Close Down Operations Entirely During Holiday Season

NEW YORK, (P-Vacation pay based on a percentage of annual earnings rather than on weekly pay is one of the most significant differences between Canada and the United States by the Mational Industrial Conference Board.

The survey includes 51 Canadian firms employing 132,710 salaried workers and wage-earners, as well as 254 U.S. firms employing more than 2,000,000.

One out of three Canadian pay after one year. companies grant vacation pay to Fourteen of the 51 Canadian vacation pay.

Over 90 per cent of the Canadian firms surveyed have formal paid vacation plans in effect. The most significant liberalization where Canadian employers reported any change in vacation policy during the last year came in longer vacations for their employees.




