### Aussie Students Do Own Housework

MELBOURNE, Australia (P) -University students will make beds, sweep floors and do most of the housework in a new series of co-operative hostels to be opened at Melbourne University by the Students' Hostels Associa-

The University Students' Representative Council will appoint student-warden who will be responsible for food, management and other details. The hostels will accommodate, on a community basis, students from country areas and those unable to enjoy the more orthodox means of city living.

Two hundred students are housed in hostels near the University under this scheme. The plan is being advanced as a measure to cope with 1,200 new students expected as a result of service discharges. Most of the hostels are old, large homes which have been reconverted.






