SHORT SPORT

A spokesman for the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association says no amateur club need worry over travelling expenses caused by participating in the C.A.H.A. playdowns. The C.A.H.A. provides transportation and berths for travelling teams and allows \$120 a day while the club is staying in a hotel and \$90 while travelling. The home team is allowed \$100 per game and the visiting team \$50 a game for incidental expenses. This applies to all games in the cup playoffs wherever and whenever they are played.

Tentative plans have been made by the Canadian Professional Golfers' Association to stage a series of mid-summer golf tournaments as a prelude to the \$10,000 open at Winnipeg in August. Tournament manager Earl Morris of the C.P.G.A. says it is the intention to group the tournaments closely so that the time the golfers will be away from their home clubs will be at a minimum. The C.P.G.A. national championship will be held separate from any other tournament, probably in mid-September.

President Branch Rickey of the Brooklyn Dodgers said yesterday that there was not a thing to the reports that he offered Catcher Mickey Owen extraordinary salary terms not to join the Mexican League. Officials of the Mexican circuit have said Rickey lured back the receiver with promises of \$20,000 per year for three years, plus all expenses and taxes. Rickey, however, would not reveal the actual terms which brought Owen back into the Dodgers' fold.

Bob Montgomery will defend the New York version of the lightweight boxing championship against Allie Stolz of Newark, New Jersey. Promoter Mike Jacobs has scheduled the fifteen-round title fight for May 17 in Madison Square Gardens in New York.

BILLY CONN HURTS HAND

PITTSBURG—A Pittsburgh newspaper (Post-Gazette) says it has received information from an apparently reliable source that heavyweight challenger Billy Conn has injured one of his hands. The newspaper says its information from Conn's training camp at Greenwood Lake, New Jersey, is to the effect that the prizefighter suffered a cut on one of his hands which will force him to lay off training for at least a week.
