**PRINCESSES CANNOT SHOP**

**Nine-Year-Old Norwegian Prince Asks For Jeep on Birthday**

OSLO — Norway's Prince Harald recently celebrated his ninth birthday—by working hard at school.

The prince, who with his mother, Crown Princess Martha and sisters, the Princess Astrid and Ragnhild, spent the war years in the United States, sits at a plain wooden desk and learns his lessons together with boys of the same age at suburban Smestad, near Oslo. He gets no favors from the instructors and if he fails to learn his lessons he is liable to school discipline as the other students are.

There was no celebration at the school on the occasion of his ninth birthday, Feb. 22, although the youngster received hundreds of letters, cables and birthday cards from friends and well wishers in Norway, America, Britain and elsewhere.

His father, Crown Prince Olav, has emphasized the boy be treated on equal terms with the other students and such days as birthdays are not, in his father's opinion, to be an excuse for a holiday. Incidentally, Prince Harald wished for an American jeep as a birthday present, but it was not granted him.

His sisters attend the Nissen Ladies' school in Oslo. They have won the respect and love of students and instructors alike for their unassuming ways.

On her first day at school 14-year-old Princess Astrid was requested by the instructor to fetch a washcloth at the caretaker's office. Astrid did not know where the office was, but she searched until she found it and returned triumphantly with the requested article.

The sisters dress in the careless fashion of Canadian high school girls and mingle freely with their classmates in the schoolyard. The girls are good at composition but Princess Ragnhild, 16, says she has trouble replying to a theme like this: "When I went out shopping with my mother."

"We can't go out shopping, you see. As soon as we slip outside all people make a hubbub about it."

**MASSETT MAN PASSES AWAY**

Arthur Robertson, for Many Years Well Known Sawmill Operator, Dies in Vancouver

News will be received with regret in Prince Rupert and throughout the Queen Charlotte Islands of the death in Vancouver on Monday of this week of Arthur Robertson, for many years a well known Massett sawmill operator. His plant was located on Delkatla Inlet and had been sold out by Mr. Robertson a few years ago. For years he shipped lumber and shingles to Prince Rupert from the mill.

Seventy years of age, Mr. Robertson was a veteran of the First Great War, having served overseas with the Canadian Forestry Corps. He is survived by his wife, who was with him in Vancouver at the end, one sister in New Zealand, two brothers and one sister in the Shetland Islands, and one sister in Liverpool.

The funeral took place Wednesday afternoon from the Chapel of the Chimes in Vancouver with Rev. H. Berry officiating and interment was made in the Field of Honor at Mountain View Cemetery.
