

GORDON & ANDERSON'S EXPANSION NEW MERCANTILE LANDMARK HERE

A landmark in the mercantile history of Prince Rupert will be observed tomorrow with the opening of the new multi-floor department store of Gordon & Anderson Ltd., whose 15,000 square feet of floor space comprise the largest store north of Vancouver and west of Edmonton.

The modern, three-floor establishment, the grand opening sale of which begins tomorrow, is stocked with what its owners believe is the widest variety of quality hardware, furniture, electrical appliances, draperies, and gift novelties obtainable at the present time. Completely rebuilt inside, the

store is housed in the Federal Block, whose top two floors contain smart departments of tasteful furnishings have surprised homemakers used to restricted wartime sales shelves.

The growth and development of Gordon and Anderson Ltd. has resulted from the foresight and business ability of its partners, Lee Gordon and Gunnar Anderson, two local men who started the concern in 1938. Since that time, ownership and control have remained entirely with the two partners.

From its original beginning on the ground floor of the Federal Block, the business has now been expanded to embrace the two upper floors. The designing of both the original and new parts of the store present clever examples of good taste and smart merchandise presentation.

Lighted throughout with cold cathode ray-lighting, which casts no shadows, the upper floor is devoted to toys, juvenile furniture, unpainted furniture and a very smart gift department. This department is an object of pride to the owners, containing as it does, fine articles from all over the world. These include chinaware, plastic art goods and a score of other types which Mr. Gordon states, the wholesalers have saved for them in anticipation of their grand opening.

"Practically all the stock in this store, with the exception of a little hardware on the first floor, is new stock, especially bought for the new store," Mr. Gordon said proudly. "We have it here in a variety and quantity that has not been seen in Prince Rupert since before the war."

The second floor contains furniture, draperies, lamps and other fine household furnishings. Also on this floor is a ladies' lounge room, and the business office. Dominating the stock on the second floor are magnificent Kroehler chesterfield suites, for which Gordon and Anderson have exclusive agency.

The first floor is given over to hardware, electrical appliances, wallpaper, floor coverings and other articles. The front

of the building is composed of show windows across its 50-foot width, and this display department extends back into the store for 35 feet, giving a street display space of sufficient depth to present attractive stock showings.

Also on the first floor are displays of Frigidaire refrigerators, Beatty washers and farm appliances, Duotherm oil heaters and ranges, Electrohome radios, and a complete line of power tools.

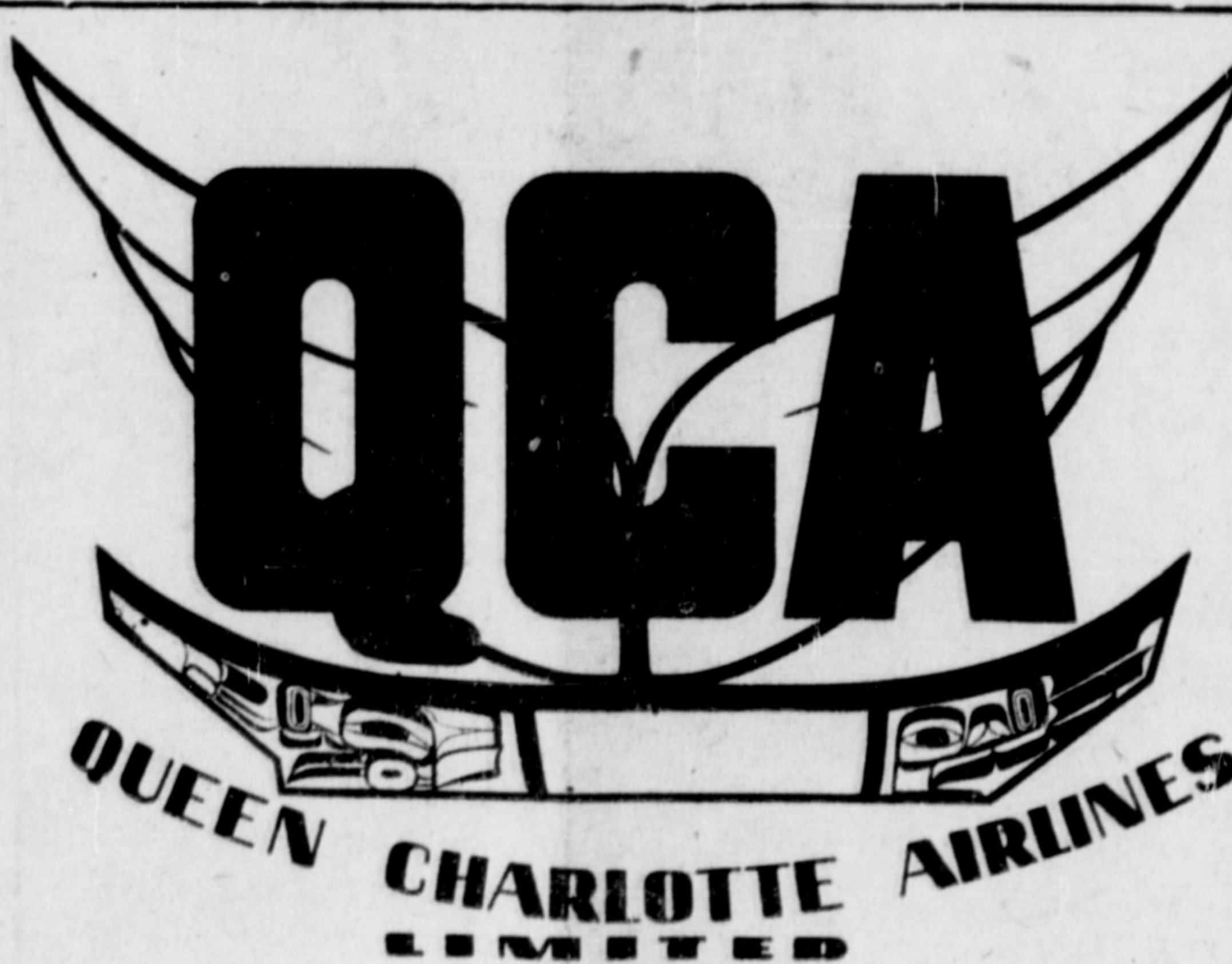
