the nation, upholding the sanctity of marriage and family life.

ARMED FORCES CONTROLLING IT

Major Moscovich told of an improvement in the venereal disease situation in the armed forces of Canada which was already evident. He ascribed this to the changed attitude to the disease and the improved mechanics in combatting it. While the rate of infection in the services had been dropping, however, the actual number of cases in the country had been increasing. "There is, therefore, no cause for complacency," declared the speaker. "The problem remains and is more pressing than ever."

Reiterating statements made by other authorities, Major Moscovich said that observations of all three of the armed services supported the view held by experts in the control of venereal disease infection for the whole country. It was clear from the records of navy, army and air force that wherever commercialized prostitution was tolerated there was found the greatest incidence of venereal disease. It was also recognized that, if these places were cleaned up, the number of men infected with venereal disease would decrease.

President A. S. Nickerson was in the chair at yesterday's Rotary Club luncheon and guests of the day, beside the speaker, were A. V. Bossons, E. C. Mapson and W. A. Arnold of Vancouver; Captain Livien of Victoria; A. E. Field of Prince Rupert.
