#### Careers Opened To War-Maimed

EXETER, Eng., April 24 (P)-Daughter of a great soldier, upright, elderly Dame Georgina Buller, has founded a college here where war-maimed soldiers and civilians are taught to take their place in society.

Since the war more than 1,000 men and women who have lost limbs have been trained to hold industrial jobs. A navy man who lost both hands has become an electric welder. A girl who lost both hands in a Buffalo at Baltimore, post- munition factory has been fitted with artificial hands and trained as an expert typist. At the college, the incapaci-

tated persons are taught to use their artificial limbs, are helped to choose a new career. they wish it, and are given technical training. More than the law from the school. While they are training, their expenses are paid and they receive spending money of about \$6 a week for men and \$4.25 for women. Married men receive an extra \$2.50 a week for their wives and \$1.25 for each child, as well as \$5.75 if they are maintaining a home.
