Socialization Versus Socialism...

"The opinions of a great number of people today trend in two separate directions, socialism and fascism," says a new booklet "The Eternal Struggle," drives and clever returns. All written by Jean Charles Harvey and published by Forward Publishing Co. Ltd. "These schools thought start from opposite poles from each other, tween the Navy and the Air ment 15 to 8. and in a general way they meet only in common distrust of private enterprise. Both of them tend to enslave to the State the productive and creative powers of the individual. In all their declarations, socialists and fascists use exactly the same words to attack their enemy: 'Let us destroy,' they say, 'economic dictatorship!"

"What do these words mean? Without any doubt they mean any form of private capital which exceeds certain indeterminate amounts, and which, in the eyes of these men, constitutes an injustice for less fortunate people. They agree to the existence of a single capitalist-or, at any rate a single controller of capital-the State. To that is to belong the power and duty to distribute wealth in such a fashion that no one will lack anything, from the eradle to the grave, and that no one-whether an individual or a corporation-will accumulate too much wealth.

"While they fight bitterly with each other, the two schools join in denouncing, with equal energy, any liberty to create material wealth, or to profit from it. After listening to their talk, millions of men have been persuaded that any individual whose occupation returns him a large income is either an enemy of society, or-what comes to the same thing —a thief.

"Far be it for men to confound these ideologies, which start from opposite points. Socialism sincerely wishes to base the authority and wealth of the State on the popular will, and thus remains theoretically a democratic movement; fascism distrusts the mass of the people, and the individual, who has no other right to live-according to the fascists-than in the service of the State; socialism does not lack ideals or generosity; fascism, denying the participation of the people in government, is nothing more than a contemporary form of all those tyrannies from which men have sought to deliver themselves for centuries.

"Yet, socialism and fascism lead, by different roads, to the suppression of all democratic liberty.

"Like all true liberals, I accept socialization but not socialism. What do we mean by one who accepts socialization? He is a man who believes in social? progress, in the right that every individual has, in liberal civilized society, to work, to learn, to find a chance to live in his own way-not simply to be provided with food, clothing and shelter, but to enjoy material and moral well-being. If a free social order should show itself incapable of elevating the masses, that would crush freedom in the troubled period through which we are passing, it will be very necessary for us to take care that we do not produce such a catastrophe. It is for that reason that we should look for social progress, and be active proponents of socialization, rather than stand by and watch the destruction of our liberal institutions."


