Waterfront Whiffs

Nelson Bros. Put up Biggest Pack on Coast This Year — McLean's Doing Repair Work — Little Halibut In

Nelson Bros. Ltd. cannery at Port Edward near Prince Rupert is credited with having put up the largest individual salmon pack for any plant on the British Columbia coast this year. It packed a total of 125,000 odd cases or about one-eighth of the entire pack for the coast. Pinks and chums, running about even, were the principal varieties although there was also a good run of sockeyes. The plant finished packing salmon early in October and the most of the crew was headed to Vancouver for a vacation between now and the time that herring canning starts in the winter. Meanwhile a working crew remains at the cannery getting it in shape for the herring work.

Two government boats are at the McLean Ways at Seal Cove receiving semi-annual overhaul — the provincial police boat P.M. L. 8 and the forestry department's White Cloud. More than a million cases of salmon were packed by coast canneries during the week ending September 30, according to the latest bulletin issued by the Chief Supervisor of Fisheries at Vancouver. This is the largest week's pack so far this season. Of the total, 703,311 cases were packed in District Two, and the Naas and Skeena River canneries, now closed, packed 425,895 cases. Pinks constituted the heaviest pack during the week, accounting for 388,147 cases. Other types packed included 246,013 cases of sockeye and 198,033 cases of chums.

First halibut boat to bring a cargo into Prince Rupert in a week, the American boat Sunset arrived Friday with 47,000 pounds aboard. The vessel's fish was sold to B. C. Packers at the ceiling price of 15 cents and 13 1/2 cents. There has been a notable decline in halibut fishing in Area Three in the last few weeks. According to the latest International Fisheries Commission figures the 27,000,000 pound quota set for that area is still 5,000,000 short of being filled. Halibut men who earlier had predicted that
