RED CROSS SHIPMENT

Knitted goods, civilian clothing, hospital supplies and surgical dressings comprised a recent shipment which was made from the local Red Cross work room to headquarters in Vancouver. The detailed list is announced by the convener of the work-room, Mrs. R. M. Winslow, as follows:

Knitted goods — Five turtle neck sweaters, six Balaclava helmets, three khaki scarves, two men's sleeveless sweaters, two W.A.S. sleeveless sweaters, two pairs gloves, two pair knickers, nine large quilts, small quilts, 5 pairs children's socks, two pairs men's socks.

Civilian clothing—One woman's coat, three girls' coats, four women's nightgowns, 19 combinations, seven girls' sweaters, one infant's set.

Hospital supplies—12 hospital jackets, 24 face cloths, two pairs bed socks.

Surgical dressings—48 scultetus bandages, 40 bed pads, 22 large tape sponges, 96 small tape sponges, 200 swabs, 630 4-inch compresses, 4,000 compresses.
