FOUR YEARS AGO IN THIS WAR

APRIL 13, 1940—British subsurface and force of British destroyers penetrated Narvik Fjord and sank seven German destroyers; three British destroyers were slightly damaged. Italian fleet gathered for manoeuvres. Modified form of martial law declared for parts of Netherlands.

LONDON, April 13—A spirit-marine Spearfish scored torpedo hits on pocket battleship Admiral Scheer; Churchill announced more than 18 German vessels and four British destroyers sunk since battle in Norwegian waters started. Germany claimed positions "consolidated" in Norway.
