## QUEEN SIGNED HIS PICTURE

Major Harry A. Hurd, Salva-  
tion Army, Took Fine Picture  
of Her Majesty During Royal  
Tour

Visiting the city at the week-  
end "because he wanted to see  
what Prince Rupert is like" was  
Major Harry A. Hurd, Salvation  
Army officer who is retiring after  
41 years of unbroken service with  
the organization, during which  
he has travelled more than a mil-  
lion miles in all parts of the  
globe.

Major Hurd, a vigorous man,  
arrived from Vancouver, and will  
continue east to Toronto, where  
he hopes to settle down.

"In all my travelling I have  
never been here before," he said.  
"I am glad I made the trip."

He is the possessor of an out-  
standing photographic study of  
Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth  
which he took at St. John's,  
Newfoundland, when the royal  
party stopped there during the  
Canadian tour in 1939. Her  
majesty stands in a striking pose  
with her arm outstretched in  
greeting.

Major Hurd sent copies of the  
picture to the Queen and other  
members of the royal family, re-  
ceiving one in return autograph-  
ed "Elizabeth R.I." Accompany-  
ing the signed picture was a  
letter from the King's secretary  
which said "The King and Queen  
are pleased to accept these  
photographs and much appreci-  
ate your kind thought in send-  
ing them."

In his recent travels Major  
Hurd has presented copies of the  
picture to the Lieutenants-Gov-  
ernors of Saskatchewan, Alberta,  
Manitoba, Ontario and New-  
foundland. Prior to coming to  
Prince Rupert he gave one to  
the mayor of Vancouver for dis-  
play in the city hall.


