Russians Battle Into Hungary's Fifth City-Germans Fearful For East Prussia

MOSCOW, Nov. 21 ()-Russian troops are battling in the outskirts of the fifth city of Hungary this morning. The city is Miskolc. Front dispatches indii cate that a German withdrawal from the area is imminent. Enemy escape routes to the east and west of the city have already been cut by Soviet forces. Miskolc is about eighty-five miles northeast of the capital city of Budapest. As this battle rages, other Russian troops have pushed to within twenty miles of the old CzechoSlovakian frontier. Berlin, meanwhile, says the Russians have opened their winter offensive in the far north against 300,000 Germans in western Latvia.
